THOMAS PARTEY GRANTED BAIL ON CHARGES OF RAPE



Former Arsenal soccer player Thomas Parthey was granted conditional bail on Tuesday after appearing in court charged with five counts of rape. The 32-year-old midfielder, who has also been charged with one count of sexual assault, appeared at Westminster Magistrates' Court, London. The alleged offenses, between 2021-22, relate to three women. The conditions of Parthey's bail include that he cannot contact any of the women and must notify police of any permanent changes of address or international travel. Parthey is a free agent after his contract at Arsenal expired at the end of June. He is reportedly set to join Spanish team Villarreal. "I understand he is no longer employed in this country and playing in Spain now," chief magistrate Paul Goldspring said.

LUKEWARM OUTING FOR INDIAN WOMEN IN ASIAN SURFING'S OPEN CATEGORY



Indian women surfers endured a tough outing in the first round of the Open category on the second day of the ASF Asian Surfing Championships on Tuesday. National champion, Kamali Moorthy posted the highest score by an Indian on the day with a 7.60, followed by Sugar Shanti who scored 4.97 points. Third on the list of Indians was Shrishti Selvam with 4.60 points, as none of them were able to progress to the next round. However, the Indians can look forward to battle again in the repechage rounds on Wednesday. Japan's Anri Matsuno was the star of the day, logging 15.34 points, the day's highest score to her third round berth.

SUB-JUNIOR BOXING NATIONALS TO BE HELD IN GREATER NOIDA



More than 700 pugilists, including 400 boys and 300 girls, will compete in the sub-junior (U-15) National Championships to be held in Greater Noida from August 7 to 13, the Boxing Federation of India (BFI) said on Tuesday. As part of BFI's broader vision to build a robust grassroots-to-elite pathway, the sub-junior nationals, to be held across 15 weight categories, will serve as a crucial platform to identify young talent and prepare them for bigger competitions. The event follows the successful conduct of the men's, women's, and junior nationals earlier this year. Haryana (girls) and Chandigarh (boys) are the defending champions. "The sub-junior nationals are where India's boxing journey truly begins," said Ajay Singh, the BFI's interim committee president-chairperson. "This platform helps identify talented individuals and allows them to experience real competition early in their careers. The skills, discipline, and confidence developed here are the first building blocks of international success. This is a significant grassroots step in these young boxers' journeys, and we're sure we'll see many stars of the future in action." Boxers will compete under World Boxing technical rules, with three rounds of 1.5 minutes each, with a minute's rest in between rounds. A 10-point scoring system will be followed. Medal winners from the REC Combined Talent Hunt 2024 are also eligible, making the competition even more competitive.

BCCI to end pick and choose culture in team

Gautam Gambhir has always been against the mega-star culture prevailing in Indian cricket but Mohammed Siraj's Herculean effort throughout the English summer has definitely given the Indian head coach a real shot in the arm. The creditable 2-2 series draw in England will certainly empower Gambhir and chairman of selectors Ajit Agarkar to crack the whip and usher in a uniform team culture where certain individuals who would not be treated more than equals as it happened in recent years. It is understood that the selection committee, Gambhir and the decision makers in the Indian cricket board are all on the same page with regards to putting an end to players picking and choosing games and series in the pretext of workload management. "There have been discussions and the message will be sent across to the centrally contracted players, especially those who are all format regulars that this culture of picking and choosing games won't be entertained in near future," a senior BCCI official privy to current happenings told PTI on conditions of anonymity. "It doesn't mean that workload management will

be thrown out of the window but a more objective approach is expected in near future. Obviously, fast bowlers' workload needs to be managed but it can't be accepted that in the name of workload management, people will miss crucial matches." Siraj, who sent down 185.3 overs across five Tests, not to forget the hours of fielding and also overs bowled in the nets during the last six

weeks is a shining example of what peak fitness looks like. More importantly, the performance of Siraj, Prasidh Krishna and Akash Deep has proved that even the biggest of stars are dispensable and no one is bigger than the team. I hope workload management disappears from Indian cricket dictionary: Sunil Gavaskar

Mohammed Siraj has "debunked forever this business of workload", said India batting great Sunil Gavaskar, questioning the concept by asserting that playing for the country should be enough to "forget the aches", something that soldiers guarding the nation are doing routinely. Siraj played all five Tests of the just-concluded drawn series against England and bowled 185.3 overs in total, picking up 23 wickets in all. However, pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah was available for only three of the games, skipping the must-win fifth Test at The Oval as part of his workload management. Gavaskar, however, made it clear that

his criticism was not directed at Bumrah, saying that his was a case of "injury management" more than anything else. "When you are playing for your country, forget the aches and the pains. On the border, do you think that the jawans are complaining about cold? What did Rishabh Pant show you? He

came out to bat with a fracture. That is what you expect from the players. Playing cricket for India is an honour," Gavaskar told 'India Today'. "You are representing 140 crore people and that is what we saw in Mohammed Siraj. I think Siraj bowled his heart out, and he debunked forever this business of work-

load. "For five Test matches, non-stop he has bowled 7-8 over spells, because the captain wanted him and the country expected of him," added the former skipper. The 76-year-old said workload management cannot come in the way of fielding the best available team. "If you are going to succumb to people who are talking about workload, then you are never going to have your best players on the field for your country," he said.

"I hope that the word 'workload' goes out of the Indian cricket dictionary. I've been saying that for a long time... And I think that is the one thing that we all should keep in mind that this workload is only a mental thing, not so much a physical thing," he added.

Namshum, Chengappa win RFC India 2025 in 4x4 extreme category

Chow Ujjal Namshum from Arunachal Pradesh and his co-driver Chethan Chengappa from Karnataka emerged champions in the in the '4x4 Extreme' category of the 11th edition of the Rainforest Challenge (RFC) India, after a week-long off-road motorsport competition held here. The duo secured 2,302 points out of a possible 2,600, completing all 26 special stages and winning 12 of them with perfect 100 scores. They also clocked the fastest timings in 14 special stages. While Namshum won the title for the first time, Chengappa enjoyed fourth win as a co-driver, a release said. Namshum also earned a free automatic entry into the Rainforest Challenge Global Grand Finale, scheduled to be held in Malaysia later this year.



Cedrick Jordan Da Silva and co-driver Mackwin Dias finished runner-up 1999 points, while Telangana's Rambabu Mareedu and Kumaraswamy Thalam were third with 1957 points. In the newly introduced '4x4 Modified' category, Goa's Steven Fernandes of Goa and his co-driver Balwant Jagram clinched the top spot with 1,622 points out of 2000. Cyril Dmello with co-driver

Ameer Sadiq of Maharashtra and Manoj Biradar with co-driver Sachin Gadashetti from Karnataka finished second and third respectively. Mihir Dharkar and co-driver Shantanu Grover of Maharashtra won the '4x4 Stock' category with 1,303 points out of 1,400, followed by Bopaiah Kongettira with

co-driver Bopanna Maleyanda and Prathan Chittiyappa with co driver Anush Byramudi, both from Karnataka.

England panicked, they just needed one partnership: Vaughan

Former captain Michael Vaughan feels England panicked on the final day of the fifth Test against India in the absence of inspirational skipper Ben Stokes, with only 35 runs needed to win and four wickets in hand. England eventually lost the match by six runs as India made a stunning comeback to draw the five-match series 2-2 on Monday. "Ben Stokes in that team, England would've won this Test match. He plays such a big role in this team, the mentality. England did panic (on the fifth morning). "They just needed one partnership. They panicked in the way that they can with the way that they play, they play with a huge amount of aggressiveness. Yesterday (Sunday) afternoon, the Harry Brook dismissal did cause that collapse, but it's the way England play," Vaughan told BBC's Test Match Special. Stokes, who played a pivotal role for England with both bat and ball, missed the fifth Test due to a shoulder injury, while pacers Jofra Archer and Brydon Carse

were rested. Vaughan said the thrilling series against India should be a perfect preparation for England for the this year's Ashes in Australia, starting in November. "It's been a tremendous five matches for England. You've got to be realistic, this week they were down to 10 men, lost one of their bowlers early, and not got Ben Stokes. You're looking at the team going to Australia and I think there's more pieces in place. "We'll arrive in Perth for that first Test and know the top seven. It's just a matter of the bowling attack and getting that right. Clearly Ben Stokes is going to have to get fit. With Ben Stokes in the England side they can beat anybody. Without him, they can lose to anybody," Vaughan said. England looked on course for a historic win with Harry Brook and Joe Root taking the home team to 301 for three on the fourth day before Brook was caught by Mohammed Siraj off the bowling of Akash Deep.
